**6:00 PM** – Meeting called to order by Mr. Cunningham.

**6:01 PM – Public Comment** – Mr. Cunningham wanted to note the passing of Louise Messner, who served as the Town of Warren’s American Disabilities Act Representative for many years.

Mr. Cunningham also wanted to thank Randy Graves for his service on the Warren Selectboard. Mr. Cunningham announced that there is a 1-year appointment term vacant on the Warren Selectboard.

**6:05 PM – Appointment of Chair of Selectboard and Vice Chair of Selectboard – Vice Chair** – Motion by Mr. Ackland to nominate Mr. Luke Youmell as Vice-Chair of the Warren Selectboard, second by Mr. Cunningham. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:06 PM – Chair Appointment** – Motion by Mr. Ackland to nominate Mr. Cunningham as Chair of the Warren Selectboard, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:07 PM – Paper of Record** – Motion by Mr. Cunningham to approve the Valley Reporter as the paper of record, second by Mr. Ackland. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:07 PM – Covid Update** – Jeff Campbell - Report Attached

**6:15 PM – Town Appointments and Appointment of Taylor Corrigan to Warren Conversation Commission** – Motion by Ms. Behn to approve the appointment of Taylor Corrigan and Town Appointments as presented, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:20 PM – Approval of Liquor License for Mac’s Convenience Store, Sherman V. Allen – 2<sup>nd</sup> Class** - Motion by Mr. Youmell to approve the 2<sup>nd</sup> Class Liquor License for Mac’s Convenience Store, Sherman V. Allen, second by Mr. Ackland. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:21 PM – Approval of Minutes for March 9, 2021** – Motion by Mr. Youmell to approve the Minutes of March 9, 2021, second by Mr. Ackland. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:22 PM – Approval of Accounts Payable** – Motion by Mr. Ackland to approve the Accounts Payable Warrants as presented for \$72,257.33, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:23 PM – Approval of Payroll Warrants as Present** – Motion by Mr. Ackland to approve the Payroll Warrants as presented for \$27,224.67, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**6:25 PM – Facility Engineer Cleaner** – Mr. Cunningham commented that the Town should pay for any supplies that they purchase since she is an employee and they should not have to fund that out of their pocket. As far as an increasing pay, she did receive the 2.5% increase as all the other Town employees received but she is subject to the personal policy. She has gone above and beyond the call of duty with the Covid pandemic and could be considered with a merit raise, however, the board felt that at present time she is making a good wage, but would like to see what other towns are paying.

**Other Business:**

Covered Bridge – Construction Inspection Services – Ms. Jones had sent around a link to the consultants that are already approved by VRANS that included detail bios of their companies and projects they had done before. Some board members read them others did not. Ms. Jones presented her recommendations of the three companies that she thought would do a good job for the Town. She recommended Stantec for various reasons.

Motion by Mr. Cunningham to approve the Construction Inspection Services of Stantec for the Covered Bridge Project, second by Mr. Ackland. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

Economic Stimulus Money – Mr. Ackland commented that the amount Washington County will receive is \$11 million. Combining what Warren will get from the municipal pot and the county pot will exceed \$300K. Mr. Ackland suggested there be thought given on how to spend such money, which cannot be used to reduce property taxes per the legislation. Mr. Ackland also shared that he proposed to the MVRVP that such funds might be pooled and used for a larger Mad River Valley Community Project.

**6:35 PM – Paving – Bob Ackland & Andrew Bombard** – Mr. Ackland commented that he had sat down with the crew regarding paving roads. There was no money budgeted in the general highway fund to pave for 2021 as Mr. Ackland presented a financial picture of the Paving Capital Fund that could cover the expense. Mr. Ackland commented that in the work plan the only road that was scheduled was the bottom of Dump Road presented to the taxpayers. Mr. Bombard commented that he would like to see Roxbury Mountain paved from Senor up to the top where it ends now, the Dump Road and the bottom section of Airport Road. They all would be a shim & pave as priced out and suggested by Pike Industries. Mr. Bombard would like to go with the recommendation by Pike on adding polymer to the wear course which adds another \$7.00 to the per ton price to the high traffic roads. Mr. Ackland tasked Mr. Bombard to get a revised quote for Roxbury from Senor up to the top of Roxbury and using the Polymer. Mr. Cunningham commented that Mr. Bombard should talk to the state to see if the product is standing up to the heavy traffic loads and is worth the extra cost. Mr. Ackland commented that he has complete trust in Pike Industries. Mr. Bombard will contact Pike for getting an updated quote and will have them write up the RFP for Mr. Bombard to send out.

Motion by Mr. Ackland to have Mr. Bretton Gardner, Pike Salesman, write up the RFP with requirements and adding that the work be done by September 10, 2021, with a \$1,000 a day fine if not completed by September 15, 2021, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**7:00 PM – Hiring of new Assistant Highway Supervisor** - The Selectboard put out an internal application for the hiring of an Assistant Highway Supervisor. There was only one application received and that was Mr. Chris Kathan. Mr. Bombard highly recommended that the board hire Mr. Kathan for that position. Ms. Behn asked for clarification that the board did not create a position just for one individual and she asked the Road Foreman that did he feel it was necessary when all other foreman's did not need an assistant. Ms. Behn specifically reference that "a member of the board" had made a statement at the February 16, 2021 meeting that this was created to give a road crew member a raise.

Mr. Cunningham commented it was part already part of the Road Department already. The board just created a job description for that. The request was made by Mr. Bombard as he did not have the time to all the administrative work and plan projects. Mr. Cunningham asked Mr. Bombard what the increase of pay should be? Mr. Bombard commented that he recommended that and additional \$1.50. Mr. Kathan had received the 2.5% increase that all employees received the first of the year as per voted in the budget.

Motion by Mr. Ackland to hire Mr. Kathan for the Assistant Highway Supervisor, with a rate pay increase of \$1.50, second by Mr. Youmell. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

**7:15 PM** – Motion by Mr. Youmell to adjourn, second by Mr. Ackland. All in Favor: VOTE: 4-0.

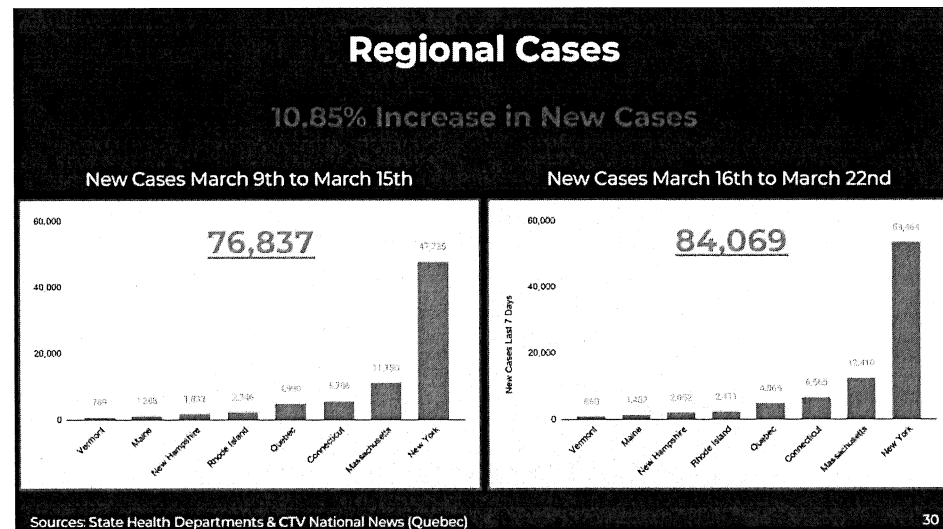

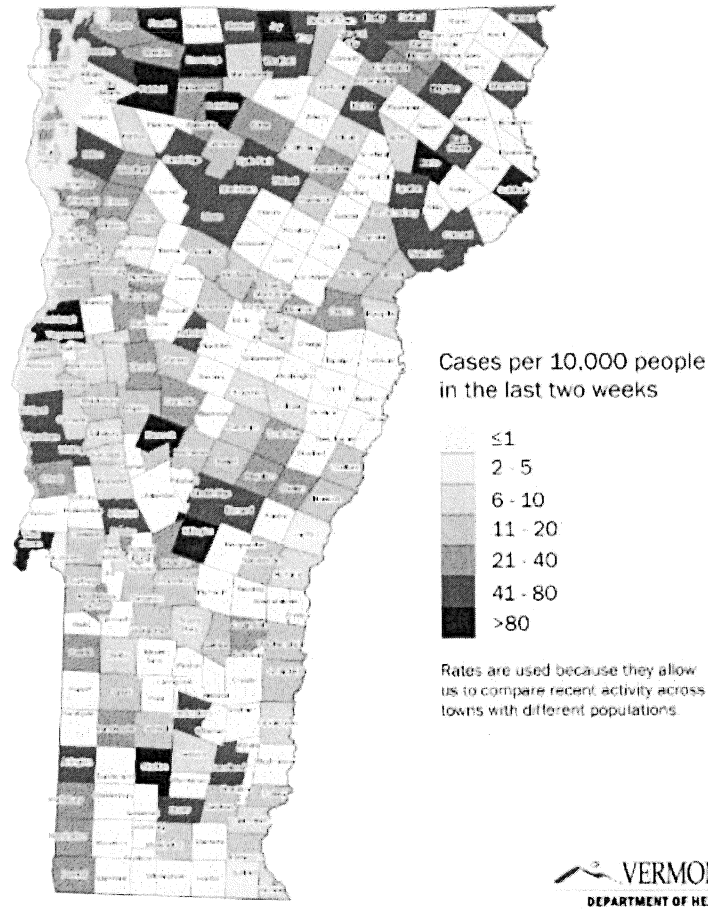

## **Update on outbreaks and clusters as of March 3,2021**

- 103 Active outbreaks, 91 Primary and 12 Secondary, 257 outbreaks have been resolved.
- There have been 726 cases among residents and 382 cases among the facility staff in Congregate Care & Living since last March
- There have been 919 cases among children and staff in Schools & Child Care since last March

## **Governors, CDC and SEOC Updates**

- Effective Wednesday, March 24: bars and social clubs, like American Legions and VFWs, are being moved under the state's restaurant guidance, which will allow them to reopen within that sector's current restrictions. These include operating at 50% capacity, requiring patrons be seated at tables with a maximum of 6 per table, 6 feet of distance between parties, masking and more. Municipalities will be able to place more restrictions on these establishments in their jurisdictions.

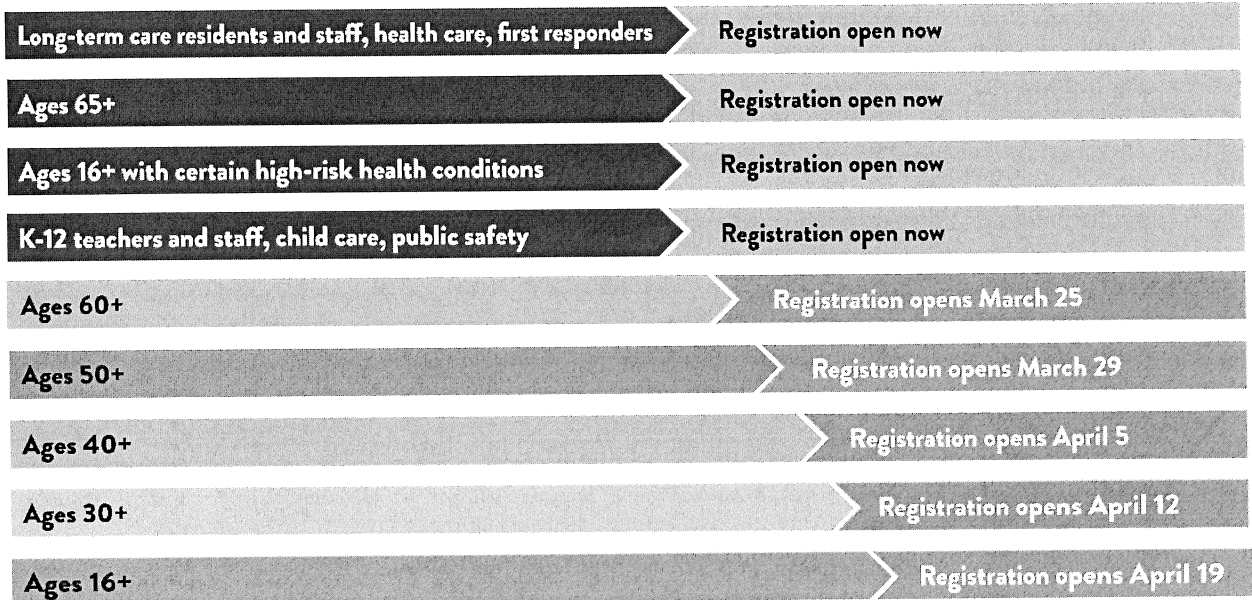
## **Testing**

- Testing continues to happen at 17 sites a day throughout the state.
- Weekend Testing at Waitsfield United Church on March 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, April 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Testing continues to be offered almost daily in Barre, Northfield, Waterbury, Middlebury, Berlin and Williamstown

## **Vaccination Planning**

- The state is averaging about 5,500 vaccination doses a day.
- Starting March 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:15, ages 60+ can begin to sign up to be vaccinated. Starting March 29<sup>th</sup> at 8:15, ages 50+ can begin to sign up to be vaccinated.
- Nearly 85.5% of 70+ Vermonters have been vaccinated with one doses and 65-69 at around 62.5%
- About 127,454 have been vaccinated in VT. Nearly 68,900 have completed their doses
- Vermont is 2nd in the Northeast with 31.85 doses administered per 100 residents, VT is 6<sup>th</sup> in the country.
- The goal is to have everyone in VT vaccinated by July 4<sup>th</sup>.
- More than 84,000,000 have been vaccinated nationwide, 45,500,000 have received 2 doses

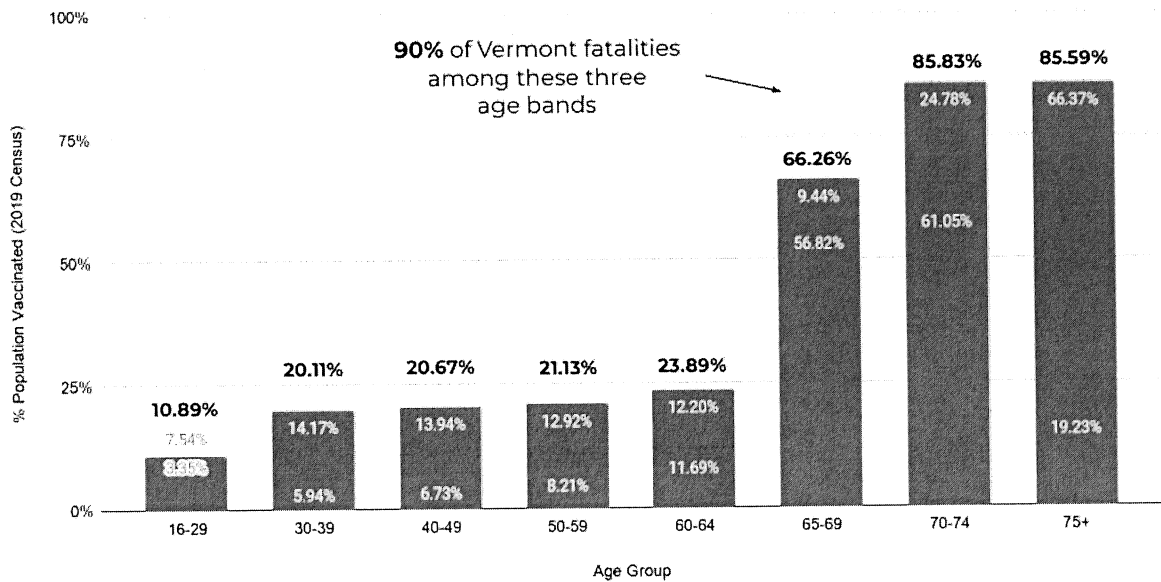

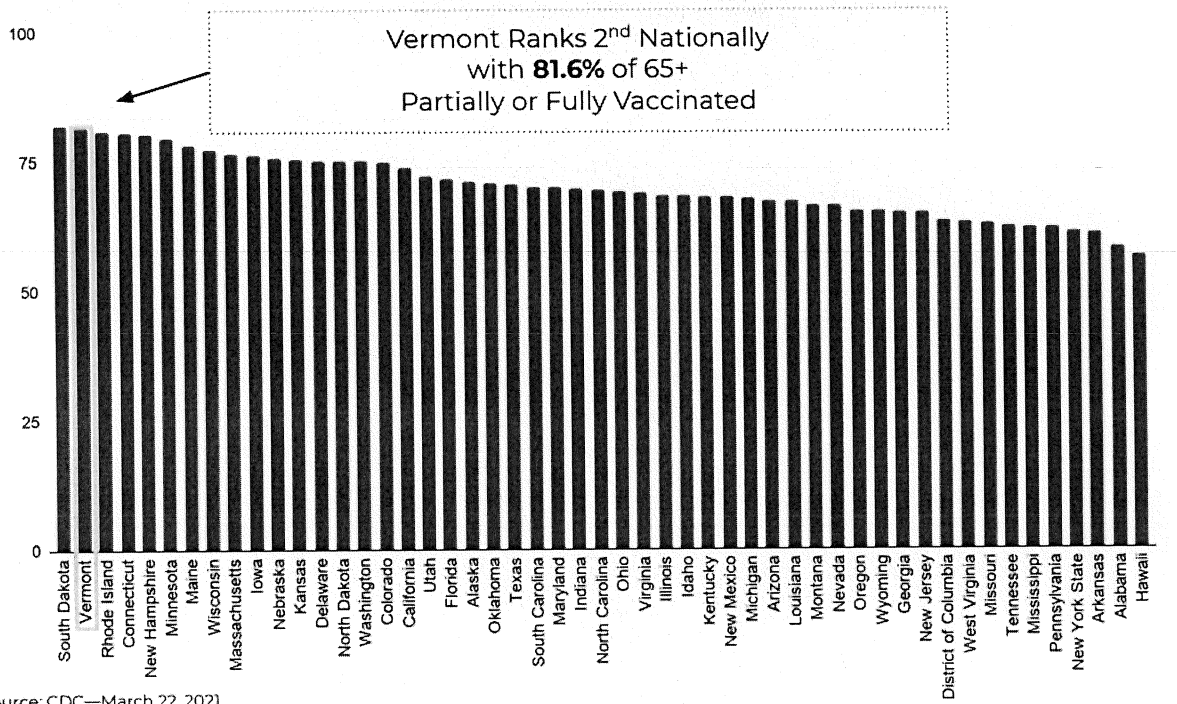

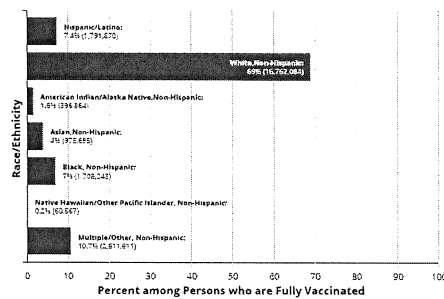

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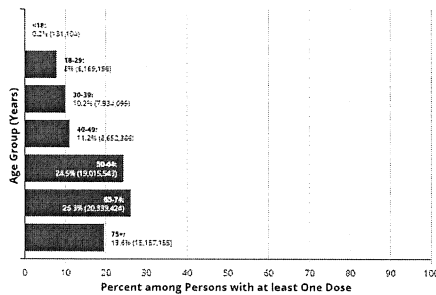

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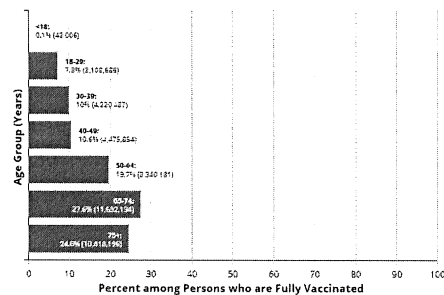

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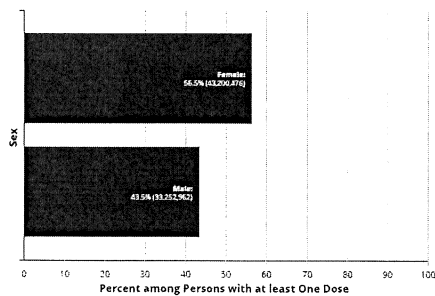
